Behavior Data	58 total behavior incidents this year. Playground is the highest area of incident. Classroom incidents increased. Second grade has the highest incident rate.
Academic Data	4 th and 5 th have completed the SRI and the numbers are looking really promising. Two 5 th grade classes have hit benchmark and quite a number of students have increased their Lexile points by more than 200. Mindy will give us a detailed report in the May meeting. Reading reward for hitting benchmark will be GoGurts (frozen) during Field Days on June 1 st , 5 th and 6 th .

School	Location	City Concerns: Crossing Guard and Crossing Signs	Response
Crescent Elementary	Information	The Sandy City crossing guard that crosses students at 11000 south is concerned about students going through the park and not crossing 11000 south at the crossing guard.	Note: Students have been doing this for years. No real way to stop this behavior. Education of the safe walking routes, to both parents and students, is the best way to address this issue.

School	Location	District Concerns	
Crescent Elementary	Parking Lot	Parents have voiced concerns about the lack of parking for parents. Although additional spaces were added, there is still not enough parking for school events. Teachers have voiced concerns that the lighting is poor for evening events. Teachers and parents have also voiced a concern about the location of signs for drop off. Additional signs would make the pick up and drop off safer.	Note: (1) One recommendation is to open the gate to the playground for additional parking. (2) Facilities is aware of the concern and will consider new upgrades on lighting per a capital outlay request. (3) The school may consider additional supervision, which may prove more significant in this area than posting signs.
