## Crescent Cubs show Gratitude!

Finding things to be grateful for everyday instills a sense of gratitude in children that goes beyond good manners — it's a mindset and a lifestyle. Cubs show Gratitude by saying "please" and "thank you", being respectful when you are given something, and by telling others you appreciate them.

## Building Resilient Kids

Some of our students are having a hard time defining appropriate boundaries. We are working on a school-wide process for students to change their tone of voice, look the other student in the eye and say "STOP"(touching, name calling, poking me) then walk away! If it happens again "STOP"( touching, name calling, poking me)"or I'll Report!" If it happens again., report what is happening to an adult. This procedure helps all children establish their own personal space and how to advocate for themselves. It also helps other children be more aware when they are doing something that is unwanted.

## Technology Fundraiser

Our fundraiser is over! Thank you to all parents and students who helped to make it a great success! We will use the \$7,410 towards purchasing new technology for our classrooms. We will have an assembly on November 10th where the teachers will get wrapped like mummies, take a pie to the face and gamble on which egg has been hard boiled. If you happen to see us on the that day, don't be surprised if you see your favorite book character or a super hero having you pull forward at car pool duty.

## Trustlands

Each year, Crescent Elementary School receives School LAND Trust monies to support our students. This year, we have been allocated \$50,392 in School LAND Trust funds. We have hired paraprofessionals to provide additional supports for students in reading, specifically during Walking to Read. Walking to Read is provided to all 1st through 5th graders to receive small group instruction on specific reading skills. This year our Reading Goal is:  
\* 80% of students in Kindergarten will be at benchmark at the end of the school year as measured by the DIBELS PSF assessment.  
\* 80% of students in 1st – 3rd grades will be at benchmark at the end of the school year as measured by the DIBELS DORF assessment.  
\* 70% of students in 4th and 5th grades will be proficient or advanced at the end of the school year as measured by RI (Reading Inventory).
